O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: Increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may so pass through things temporal, that we lose not the things eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The First Lesson: 1 Kings 19:4-8

Note: Elisha was a prophet of the g^{th} c. BC, successor to Elijah. He was known for miracles of practical aid, helping the poor, and healing even those at the point of death. Here is a moment when he needed healing and hope from the living God.

Elijah went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

The Psalm 34:1-8

Note: This psalm encourages us to cry out to the Lord in our distress. Moreover, to set our pride aside. There is no shame in asking for help.

- 8 Taste and see that the LORD is good; * happy are they who trust in him!

The Epistle: Ephesians 4:25-5:2

Note: The people of this church are essentially good people whom Paul encourages. However, he knows, like all people, we are tempted into divisions for a variety of reasons. In such time we are not to rest in our anger, but turn to God and renew our faith.

Putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors, for we are members of one another. Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not make room for the devil. Thieves must give up stealing; rather let them labor and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy. Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

The Holy Gospel: John 6:35, 41-51

Note: The problem of belief among those of his own hometown and country is not that they don't know him but rather that they know him too well. Many want to constrain Jesus into their own definition of who he is. Jesus shows us that only God defines us.

Jesus said. "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." They were saying, "Is not

this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" Jesus answered them, "Do not complain among yourselves. No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me; and I will raise that person up on the last day. It is written in the prophets, 'And they shall all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Very truly, I tell you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

Nourishing Faith for the Journey

It is reassuring to know that even prophets get depressed from time to time. Jonah famously stops off after God forgives the people of Nineveh and mopes under the shade of a plant. This Sunday we have Elisha grumbling under a broom tree.

But God doesn't leave them alone. God keeps pestering them. "Get up and eat, Elisha". God provokes the prophet who asks for death rather than moving an inch.

Jesus does the same. "Come to me, all those who are carrying heavy burdens and I will refresh you". He claims he is the Bread of Life come down from heaven not for his own sake, but for ours. He urges us, through our struggles, to come to us knowing that it is God in us who draw us to him, to "get up and eat".

We all have a journey ahead of us. There are times when we want to throw in the towel. Jesus wants to nourish us precisely when we are starved of life. He gives us eternal life, which is more than life after death: it is life before death. It is the abiding relationship with Jesus.

Feed on him with your heart, by faith, with thanksgiving.
