The Collect of the Day, standing

Set us free, O God, from the bondage of our sins, and give us the liberty of that abundant life which you have made known to us in your Son our Savior Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The First Lesson: Isaiah 6: 1-13

Note: All the readings this Sunday are about being called into the service of God. This reading is the call of the prophet and it goes much in the same way as other such calls. The subject usually says something like: pick somebody else. There are many excuses, but you can't say no to God. We are ever walking in his sight.

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts;

the whole earth is full of his glory."

The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!" And he said, "Go and say to this people:

`Keep listening, but do not comprehend; keep looking, but do not understand. Make the mind of this people dull, and stop their ears,

and shut their eyes, so that they may not look with their eyes, and listen with their ears, and comprehend with their minds, and turn and be healed." Then I said, "How long, O Lord?" And he said: "Until cities lie waste without inhabitant, and houses without people, and the land is utterly desolate; until the Lord sends everyone far away, and vast is the emptiness in the midst of the land. Even if a tenth part remain in it. it will be burned again, like a terebinth or an oak whose stump remains standing when it is felled." The holy seed is its stump.

Psalm 19: Confitebor tibi

Note: This psalm is largely a psalm of praise. It is a declaration that God will answer when we call to him. The reverse is also true: we will answer God when God calls us. "The Lord will make good his purpose for me".

1 I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with my whole heart; * before the gods I will sing your praise.

2 I will bow down toward your holy temple and praise your Name, * because of your love and faithfulness;

3 For you have glorified your Name * and your word above all things.

4 When I called, you answered me; * you increased my strength within me.

5 All the kings of the earth will praise you, O Lord, * when they have heard the words of your mouth.

6 They will sing of the ways of the Lord, * that great is the glory of the Lord.

7 Though the Lord be high, he cares for the lowly; * he perceives the haughty from afar.

8 Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you keep me safe; * you stretch forth your hand against the fury of my enemies; your right hand shall save me.

9 The Lord will make good his purpose for me; * O Lord, your love endures for ever; do not abandon the works of your hands.

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 15: 1-11

Note: Chapter 15 is about the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is about Christ appearing to various people after his death, and lastly, to Paul. That appearance was the story of Paul's conversion and call. To be in the presence of God is to be changed.

I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you--unless you have come to believe in vain.

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them-

-though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

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Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

Church Growth and Fishing Tackle

Jesus tells Peter, James, and John that he will make them "fishers of people". Of course, we know this has an evangelical meaning. It is meant to enlist participation in the project of the numerical growth of the Jesus movement. But doesn't the phrase convey more of sales job on an unexpected populace rather than a holy enterprise?

Fish, presumably, don't want to be caught. In fact, in my limited experience, they do everything they can to evade our catching. I am convinced they can see us far more than we can see them, and they take full use of that advantage.

But perhaps that is the point. Human beings, by and large, do not want to be caught. They don't want to lose control, even though the control they think they have is largely illusory. That realization is perhaps the first part of the "catching". They have to realize that their lives are driven by other factors, by habits acquired and by outside forces, not all of them good.

The second step is the realization of a brighter vision. It is getting a glimpse of the glory of God in one's life and understanding that it is not a projection or wishful thinking but that it is the truth and, funnily enough, the truth turns out to be good news.

So we do get "caught" by the gospel. We get caught in the sense that it is not what we expected. Our lives have changed. We see the world differently. We see other people differently.

So we share what we have experienced and, perhaps, discover another person who was just waiting to be caught even though they didn't know it. Surprise!
